5 Reasons Not To Put Off Your Cat's Check Up:

- 1. Cats age much faster than we do-** A cat's first year of life is equivalent to 15 human years! By the age of 3, your cat ages 4 "cat years" every year. Imagine the difference 4 years makes on your physical and internal health.
- 2. Cats are stoic-** Cat's are good at hiding signs of illness or pain. Without routine check-ups your cat can develop an illness or condition long before you pick up any of the signs or symptoms.
- 3. Obesity is often overlooked in cats-** Roughly 50% of cats are considered obese. Monitoring your cat's weight routinely can greatly reduce the risk of heart disease, respiratory illnesses, kidney disease, and more.
- 4. Behavior changes-** Even subtle changes in activity level and appetite can be a sign of the start of an illness. Routine lab work can help detect early onset.
- 5. Being proactive with preventative care is better than reactive care-** Routine check-ups and consultations with your vet can help your cat stay healthy and avoid costly and uncomfortable treatments for illnesses and conditions that could have been prevented or treated early.
