Pet Friendly Pumpkin Treats:
-2 and ½ cups flour
-2 eggs
-1/2 cup canned or fresh pumpkin puree (non-seasoned)
-2 tablespoons peanut butter (organic or xylitol free)
-1/2 tsp. salt
-pinch of cinnamon
Combine all ingredients. Add small amounts of water to keep from crumbling. Roll on a floured surface until ½ inch thick. Cut into desired shapes and bake at 350 for about 30-35 mins until desired firmness (bake for less time to make treats softer for older dogs or those with minimal teeth).

5 Tips to pet winter safety

As the weather gets cooler, its best to keep your companion inside as much as possible. If your pet must be outside be sure there is adequate shelter with the opening away from the wind. An adequate shelter is 3 times the size of the animal.

Shorten outdoor exercise during the coldest parts of the day and night.

Continue using your pet's monthly parasite preventions. While some parasites such as fleas and ticks may become dormant, they are still active on your pet during the winter months and can still hibernate in your home.

When the weather is cold, cats like to find a warm place to sleep. Make some noise and pound on your hood before starting your engine.

Antifreeze is tasty and lethal to pets. Be sure to keep these toxic car products up and out of reach and remove any spills right away!
